2. This is a fiction involving a solution of a crime or the discovering of clues and secrets.
3. Can involve songs, stories, myths, and proverbs of a people or "folk" and is handed down by generation or by word of mouth.
5. A story with imaginary and often futuristic elements or can take place on other planets. Usually involves scientific innovations.
7. Is like a legend or written in narrative style, and is often historical. Usually has various gods involved.
8. Similar to a legend, a fable is a narrative and it often involves a useful truth. Sometimes animals will speak. This narrative can have supernatural elements.

## DOWN

1. This fiction has events that often evoke a feeling of fear or dread in both the characters and the reader.
3. Stories with either fairies or magical creatures and characters and are usually written for children.
4. Written as a narrative, the content could be a true story, but it is fictional, even when it is sometimes based on fact, it is imaginary.
6. This fiction will involve strange or other worldly settings and/or characters. Doesn't deal in reality.



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8. A story that is sometimes about a folk hero. It has some fact and some imagination.

4. Full of fun, comedy and excitement, it is written to entertain. you.

6. Can be a humorous story that is too far fetched to be true. Often includes exaggeration and/or hyperbole.



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
