To use an ATM, you will need to know your secret code or PIN. It's like a password that you use to make sure only you can access your money. You have to enter your PIN on the ATM's keypad to do any transaction.

Remember, when using an ATM, always have a grown-up with you to help and make sure it's safe. It's important to keep your PIN a secret and not share it with anyone.
