



The 4 Main Types of Clouds and Most Frequently Used Words to Describe Them

Stratus Clouds: very low | covers most of the sky | gray, some white

often means rain, drizzle, snow | gray overcast | can cause fog or mist



Cumulus: fluffy | puffy | like balls of cotton or cauliflower |

mostly white, just a bit of gray | flatter bottom | means sunny days

| means fair weather unless they grow to be very big.



Cirrus: very high in the sky | wispy | like a horse tail,

|feathery | usually means good weather or that a change in weather is coming.



Cumulonimbus: very low and close to the ground but multi level and can be high

mostly gray, some white | often means heavy rains and thunderstorms |
