



Courage Lesson Ideas

1. Write a poem about courage.
2. List individuals in book that display courage.
3. Name cartoon characters that show courage.
4. Write a story about a courageous person.
5. Write an acrostic poem about courage.
6. How many statements can you write about courage? (*Doing the right thing even though you don't want to, stand up to bullying, report inappropriate behaviors, stand up for others etc.*)
7. Put up a wall of courage, have each student write something they did that demonstrated courage and put it on the courage wall.
8. Read stories about heroes and list all the courageous things they did.
9. Give an example of a time when you faced a fear and explain why facing a fear is courageous.
10. Interview fellow students to find out when they have been courageous.
11. Write what these following quotes mean:
 - Courage is being afraid but going on anyhow. ~ *Dan Rather*
 - Courage is doing what you're afraid to do. They're can be no courage unless you're scared. ~ *Edward Vernon Rickenbacker*
 - Courage is a peculiar kind of fear. ~ *Charles Kennedy*
 - Courage is knowing what not to fear. ~ *Plato*
 - Courage is not living without fear. Courage is being scared to death and doing the right thing anyway. ~ *Chae Richardson*
