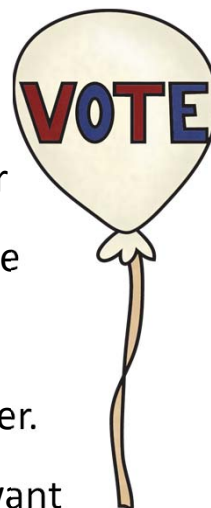


Elections:
