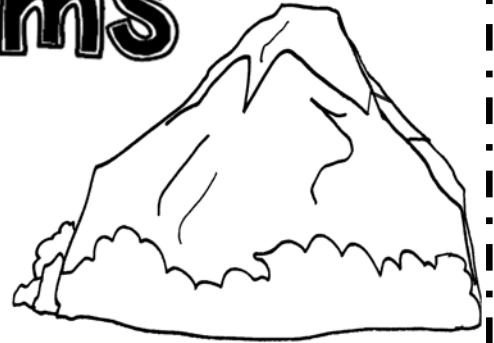

This is a valley. A valley is formed by erosion from the water and the wind.

This is a sand dune. A sand dune is formed by deposition from the blowing wind.

This is a canyon. A canyon is formed by erosion and weathering by a river over thousands of years.

This is a cave. A cave is formed when the rock gets hollowed out over time by wind or water, parts of rock and soil get washed away from erosion and weathering.

This is a delta. A delta is formed by sand, silt and small rocks that get deposited at the river mouth and are caused by depositions.

This is a glacier. A glacier has formed many of the landforms on earth. A glacier moves slowly and erodes the land leaving deposits over thousands of years.

This is a sinkhole. A sinkhole is formed by erosion and weathering.

This is a beach. Beaches are formed over a long period of time when the waves moved the rocks back and forth over the ocean. This caused rocks to break down into sand at the beach! Beaches are formed from weathering and erosion.

This is a cliff. A cliff is formed by erosion and weathering, waves and wind erode the land and carry away the sand and soil.
