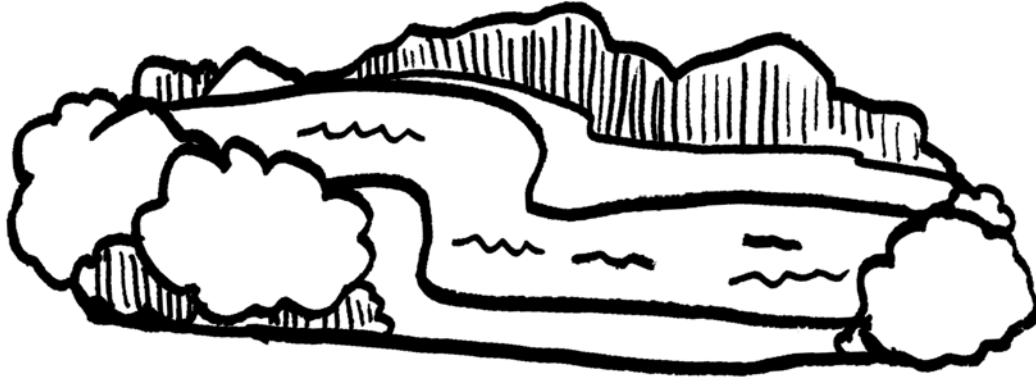


My Book About Bodies of Water

This is a gulf. Gulfs are usually saltwater and are large bodies of water with land on three sides. Gulfs are smaller than oceans but larger than lakes.

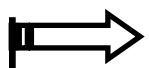
This is a glacier. Glaciers are large frozen bodies of water that are slow moving.

This is a puddle. Puddles are freshwater and are formed by rain or melted snow.

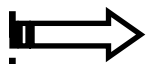
This is a pond. A pond is a small body of freshwater surrounded by land.

This is a waterfall. Waterfalls happen when a stream or a river flows over steep areas. Waterfalls are freshwater.

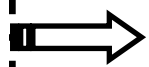

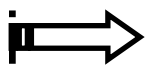
The biggest ocean is the Atlantic Ocean.



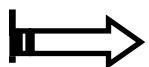
The smallest ocean is the Arctic Ocean.
