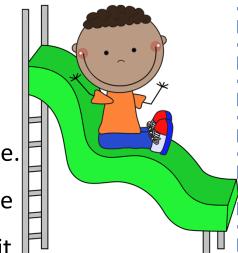
How to Ride a Slide

To ride a slide, first you have to find a side.

Look for a playground that has a slide. The slide will have steps like a ladder to climb up.

Climb up the steps carefully, one foot at a time.

Take your time to be safe. When you reach the top of the ladder, you will see the platform. Sit



down on the platform at the top of the slide and face the part of the slide that goes down. Hold onto the sides of the slide with your hands. Take a deep breath and push yourself forward and let go of your hands. Keep your legs straight and when you reach the bottom, let your feet touch the ground. Land with your feet, not your bottom. Remember to take turns if there are other kids there. Now that you know how to use the slide, have fun!
