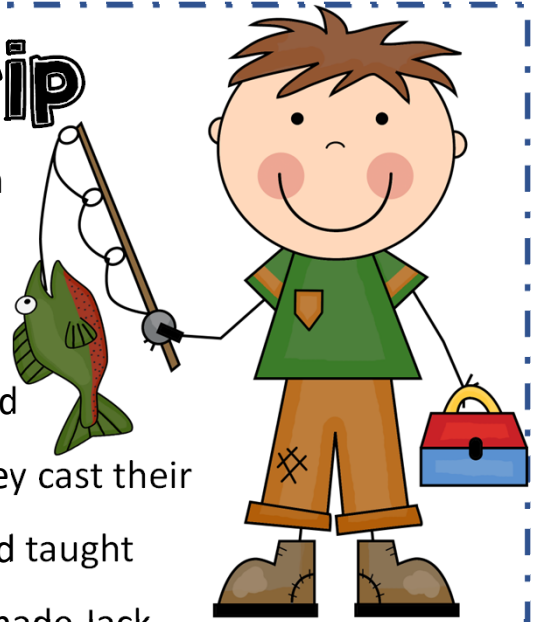


The Fishing Trip
