Earth also has mountains that reach up high like giants, rivers that flow like long snakes, and deserts that are big sandy playgrounds. But remember, some of the deserts are super hot, so we'd need lots of water to play there!

And don't forget the forests! They are like Earth's fluffy green hair, full of trees, birds, and animals. The next time you spin a globe or look at a map, try to remember all the names of the continents, oceans, and the great places you can find on our Big Blue Marble.
