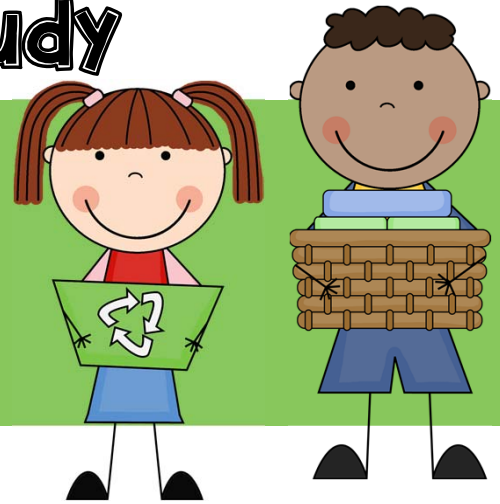


Sentence Study

Possible Answers:

-It's an imperative sentence, it makes a command—asks the reader to do something.

-It has a comma to separate 2 thoughts

-Do is a verb

-Easy is a verb

-What is a pronoun

-Right is an adjective

-Stand out is a phrasal verb

This sentence provides lots of opportunity to talk about doing the right thing and it may take courage.

Similar sentences could be—

Eat what is healthy, not just what tastes great.

Be your best, even when nobody is looking.
