THINK SHEETS: How To Use Effectively

- It is important to approach the conversation with empathy, understanding, and without placing blame.
- Create a safe and non-judgemental environment, usually a private location to ensure the child can express themselves without fear or ridicule.
- Listen fully without interrupting or passing judgement.
- Use open ended questions vs a question that only required a one word answer.
- Explain the inappropriate behavior and its impact and discuss alternative perspectives.
- Guide students towards understanding the impact of their actions.
- Use a collaborative, problem solving approach engaging the student to find appropriate or alternative solutions.
- Brainstorm alternative strategies and discuss potential outcomes of each approach.
- Reinforce positive behaviors and encourage children to learn from their inappropriate
 actions or choices
- Always emphasize the importance of treating others with kindness and respect
- Explain that mistakes are growth for learning.
- Follow up and monitor progress always reinforcing positive behaviors.

Remember, each student and situation is unique, it is important to tailor your approach accordingly. Building trust and maintaining a respectful dialogue are key to helping students understand and address their inappropriate behaviors effectively.
