

Vowel Games

1.Vowel Bingo:

1. Create Bingo cards with different vowel pictures instead of numbers.
2. Use vowel picture cards as the calling cards.
3. Students mark the corresponding vowel picture on their cards when it is called out.

2.Vowel Memory Match (concentration):

1. Make pairs of the vowel picture cards (two cards with the same vowel sound).
2. OR – make one set of pictures and one set of words and play memory match
3. Place the cards face down and have students take turns flipping over two cards at a time, trying to find matching pairs.

3.Vowel Sorting:

1. Use the set of vowel picture cards representing different vowel sounds.
2. Have students sort the cards into piles based on the vowel sound they hear.

4.Vowel Fishing:

1. Attach vowel picture cards to paperclips and place them in a "fishing pond" (a container filled with sand or rice).
2. Students use a toy fishing rod to "catch" a vowel card and identify the vowel sound.

5.Vowel Leaders:

1. Give 5 students a vowel letter.
2. Provide students with a vowel picture card and have them find their leader. Repeat.

6.I have who has:

1. One student starts, I have hug with the vowel u, who has bat with the vowel a, I have bat with the vowel a, who has five with the vowel e...and continue until the game is done.

7.Student Vowel Partners

1. Hand out words to half of the students, and pictures of the words to the other students. Ask students to find their partner based on the picture/word match.
